- Hobby course activities were carried out for a total of **1,500** people,


Psychosocial support was provided to

We reached young children who had been affected by the earthquake and their families. We invited them to our biscuit and cake-making workshop. We made biscuits and cakes together.



We tried to offer moral support people to accommodated in the camps and container settlements through hobby courses. We psychosocial support ran sessions in some of our adult education courses.



carried We out social activities for adaptation apprentice students who changed their places of residence after the earthquake and registered with the Nilüfer Vocational Training Centre, which is included in IMEP, as well as for their families.

We organised classes in various subjects including Turkish, English, mathematics and history for primary school, middle school and high school students whose education had been interrupted. We supported the children in continuing their normal lives by keeping them connected with education.



We held exhibitions of our paintings which were prepared with the participation of apprentice students. We supported earthquake victims with the revenues obtained from the sale of the works in these exhibitions.



What do beneficiaries and practitioners think about the project?

When we touched the lives of the children and their families and spent time with them, it did them good and it did us good as well.

We were very honoured to study with the children and young people and provide them with educational opportunities, however limited.

Human beings are home to one another. We will heal our wounds by helping one another and showing solidarity.
