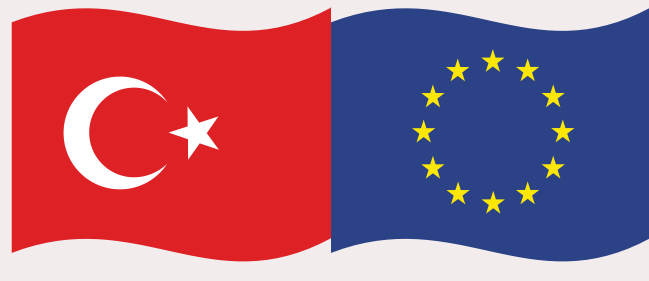

Purpose

We aimed to increase the mastery of the content regarding the apprenticeship training contract signed by the apprentice students as well as apprentice students' rights and responsibilities through sports activities. With our project, we aimed to draw attention to the issue of student rights and environmental protection and to bring apprentice students together with stakeholders on this issue.

Target Audience

The target audience of our project consists of apprentice students enrolled in the 9th grade in our school.

16 apprentice students,
2 teachers, and **3** business officials worked for the project;



- **392** people were included in awareness-raising activities,
- **16** students participated in a football match,
- **80** plastic bottles usage was prevented,
- **31** grams of greenhouse gas release into the atmosphere was prevented.

We have noticed that our students have rights-based problems because they do not know enough about the content of the contract they have signed with the businesses. We designed our project to address these problems.



Within the scope of apprenticeship training contract, we organized information activities on student rights and responsibilities with 9th graders in our school. Besides, in these activities, we carried out awareness-raising activities on the situation on our planet with the matching cards we learned in solidarity training.



After these activities, we applied a test to our apprentice students to reveal the level of understanding of the content of the contract. We organized a football match with 16 students who showed high performance in the tests.



We supported our students who attended and watched the football match to use water bottles made of materials that do not harm nature.



At the end of the football match, we presented medals to all match participants and strengthened our solidarity muscles within the framework of our rights.



What do beneficiaries and practitioners think about the project?

What we learn about our rights and responsibilities will be of great use to us throughout our apprenticeship. We think that these meetings should be held regularly.



With this project, we have become aware of our rights as apprentice students in businesses.

The fact that the business officials stated that they were not aware of many articles in the contracts showed us that we, as the school, should make systematic efforts in this regard.

Providing clarity on legal issues between businesses and apprentice students will greatly support minimizing existing problems.



Recommendations for implementing and improving the project

- Expanding the impact of the project by involving stakeholders outside the school
- Providing regular training and supervision to businesses on the rights and responsibilities of apprentice students

- Raising awareness of parents about apprentice student rights
- Inclusion of human and children's rights issues in the course contents

- Combining sports and art activities with rights-based activities
- Questioning consumption preferences in activity applications, making environmental-friendly choices
